**Context:**

Current priority of the Government is to institutionalize and consolidate the peace process by rapidly addressing the provisions stipulated in the CPA and by addressing the underlying problems of exclusion linked with caste, ethnicities, regional issues, religions etc. If the state does not quickly address the provisions mentioned in the CPA there are risks that the country might once again plunge into fragmented conflict.

In addition, existing government structures have not been able to ensure equitable distribution of resources and opportunities to address the peace process. These realities suggest that the GoN was in need of support of the mechanisms like Nepal Peace Trust Fund (NPTF), which is led by the GoN and technically and financially supported by the donors.

**Objectives:**

- To enhance the institutional and organizational capacity of the PFS through improved
  - (i) Programme management systems
  - (ii) Monitoring and evaluation systems
  - (iii) Working system and facilities
- To capacitate the sectoral working groups and major implementation agencies of the NPTF financed projects.

**Summary of Achievements:**

- Training on multi donor trust fund management and implementation is provided to 10 officials of MoPR/NPTF.
- The project activities are implemented as scheduled.

- Enhanced capacity of NPTF for its effective and efficient functioning.
